

Our Story!

- My Mom Doris was diagnosed with dementia in 2006 when she was 77 years old.
- By 2014 she no longer remembered who I was,
 BUT our lifelong connection through LEGO bricks kept our communication alive.
- After 16 years with this disease my Mom died on January 31st, 2022, three weeks prior to her 93rd birthday.






How It All Started!

- Mom brought me my first box of LEGO bricks when I was 5 years old.
- Through my teenage to adult years Mom and I spent hours talking and building LEGO models.
- After Mom's diagnosis I used the LEGO bricks to get her to share her feelings. It brought us so much JOY that I knew I had to share it with others.










The LEGO Group

- Created by Ole Kirk Kristiansen in Denmark in 1932, but it wasn't named until 1935 when he chose the name LEGO.
 - LEGO is the combination of two Danish words



which in English means to "PLAY WELL"!

The Creation of LEGO Serious Play (LSP)



1999 LSP created to improve company internal processes!



What is LEGO Serious Play?

A facilitated methodology that guides participants through a process of creative thinking, expression, listening, goal setting and problem solving.

During a LSP session each participant builds a response, answer, or solution to a question or task with LEGO bricks.





Four Parts of LEGO Serious Play






(One Session typically has up to 3 building rounds – up to 2 hours)

Why LEGO Serious Play Works for Seniors with Dementia...



I knew building would give those with dementia JOY because the task didn't require specific instructions.



Sharing allows them to tell their stories which can be so joyful and emotional for them and for their care partners. So many previously untold stories can result.



Reflecting is such a great process for those with dementia because at times they can remember so many surprising things.

LEGO Serious Play Based on Building Metaphors!



This may look like just a green LEGO brick, but it's actually an organization looking to GROW.

Participants turn their thoughts into metaphors

Metaphors unlock imaginations

• Bricks become whatever builder says they are...

• Listening to each other's stories are as important as the stories themselves.

Late Stage

- LEGO Art
- Engagement




Early Stage

- Start small Don't spend a lot
- Do whatever is fun!
- Build and Talk
- Listen to the stories
- Laugh a lot

LSP works brilliantly in the early stage because the sharing and reflecting steps can be amazing!







Middle Stage

- Focus on the outcome and less on the process
- Encourage and praise their work
- Stay engaged with them
- Involve kids if possible







Workshop: Building Hope!


